MEMBERSHIP OPTIONS FOR THE 2025-2026 BOWLING SEASON

Below are the membership options your league bowlers will have for the 2025-2026 bowling season.

TOURNAMENT MEMBERSHIP – \$62.00

The tournament membership includes all services and benefits now offered, plus your membership fees and one (1) tournament entry fee for the ***High-Low Doubles, Holiday Classic and Triples Tournament***, a savings of \$3.00 per member. The tournament membership will be payable by the High-Low Doubles entry deadline of **OCTOBER 19, 2025**.

REGULAR MEMBERSHIP – \$20.00

The regular membership includes all services and benefits now offered, but ***all tournament entry fees for the High-Low Doubles, Holiday Classic and Triples Tournament are extra.***

SENIOR/SOO/BLIND MEMBERSHIP – \$7.00

The Senior/SOO (Special Olympics Ontario)/Blind membership, exclusive to those leagues only, includes all services and benefits now offered, but ***all tournament entry fees for the High-Low Doubles, Holiday Classic and Triples Tournament are extra.***

A Senior League will be recognized where ***all league bowlers (100%) are 50 years of age and over*** as of December 31st of the current bowling season.

YBO (Under 18) MEMBERSHIP – \$7.00

The YBO (Under 18) membership is for any YBO bowler under the age of 18 who wants to become a member of an adult league. ***Please Note: These bowlers are not eligible for any tournaments.***

YBO SENIOR BOWLER GRADUATES

Any YBO graduates who join your league, in their first year of eligibility, will receive a **FREE TOURNAMENT MEMBERSHIP**.

DUPLICATE MEMBERSHIP POLICY

The Duplicate Membership Policy is as follows:

"If a bowler is bowling in two (2) or more leagues in the same Zone Association, **PLEASE** make sure they are registered in one (1) of their leagues and marked as a duplicate in any other league(s) in the same Zone Association. This would also apply for anyone bowling in two (2) or more leagues in Decentralized Associations within the same Zone". However, if a bowler is bowling in a league in a different Zone, that bowler must be registered separately in each Zone Association.

Example: A member bowls in an Ottawa Valley League and they also bowl at Merivale and/or at Orleans, and without having to pay an extra membership fee, they would be considered a duplicate in those Associations. ***The bowler would decide which League they have their primary membership.***

THEFT INSURANCE

The Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association has adopted a **FREE** Insurance Program for all Sanctioned Leagues to protect from the theft of league funds.

Sanctioned Leagues (**if they choose to participate**) will be insured against the loss of up to \$5,000.00 (five thousand dollars) with the first \$100.00 (one hundred dollars) of such loss to be deductible from the insurance benefit to be paid. **There is no premium charged to Sanctioned Leagues.**

In order to be eligible for this **FREE** coverage, Sanctioned Leagues must simply comply with the following guidelines:

1. Three (3) duly elected signing officers are registered with and approved by the Provincial Office for each bank account.
2. Detailed information concerning names, number and bank branch locations is filed with the Provincial Office for each bank account on forms provided for that purpose.
3. Two (2) of the three signing officers' signatures are required on all cheques and other withdrawals on all bank accounts. The signature of two (2) league signing officers, who are related in any way by birth, marriage, common-law or adoption **SHALL NOT** solely appear on the same document, cheque or withdrawal.
4. The President verifies, at least monthly, the balance in all bank accounts as reported by the Treasurer, who completes the **BANK BALANCE VERIFICATION FORM** and files it with the Local Zone or Decentralized Association.
5. **ALL LEAGUE MEMBERS** must be members of the Local Zone or Decentralized Association affiliated with the Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association.

On the following page is your **SANCTIONED LEAGUE INSURANCE REGISTRATION FORM**, which must be completed and returned to the Provincial Office at the beginning of the 2025-2026 bowling season. The only continuing requirement would be for the League President to check the bank balance at least monthly. It will then simply be a matter for the League Treasurer to enter the new bank balance each week on the League's Weekly Standing Sheet, and for the League President and Treasurer to initial that weekly update.

As long as these minimal rules are followed, there is unlikely ever to be a theft of League Funds, because they encourage leagues to follow sound business practices. That is the reason we can afford to offer the protection free to Sanctioned Leagues.

Upon receiving the **SANCTIONED LEAGUE INSURANCE REGISTRATION FORM** in the Provincial Office, we will forward a supply of **BANK BALANCE VERIFICATION FORMS**, which should be completed and returned monthly to your Local Zone or Decentralized Association, after obtaining your league President's approval.

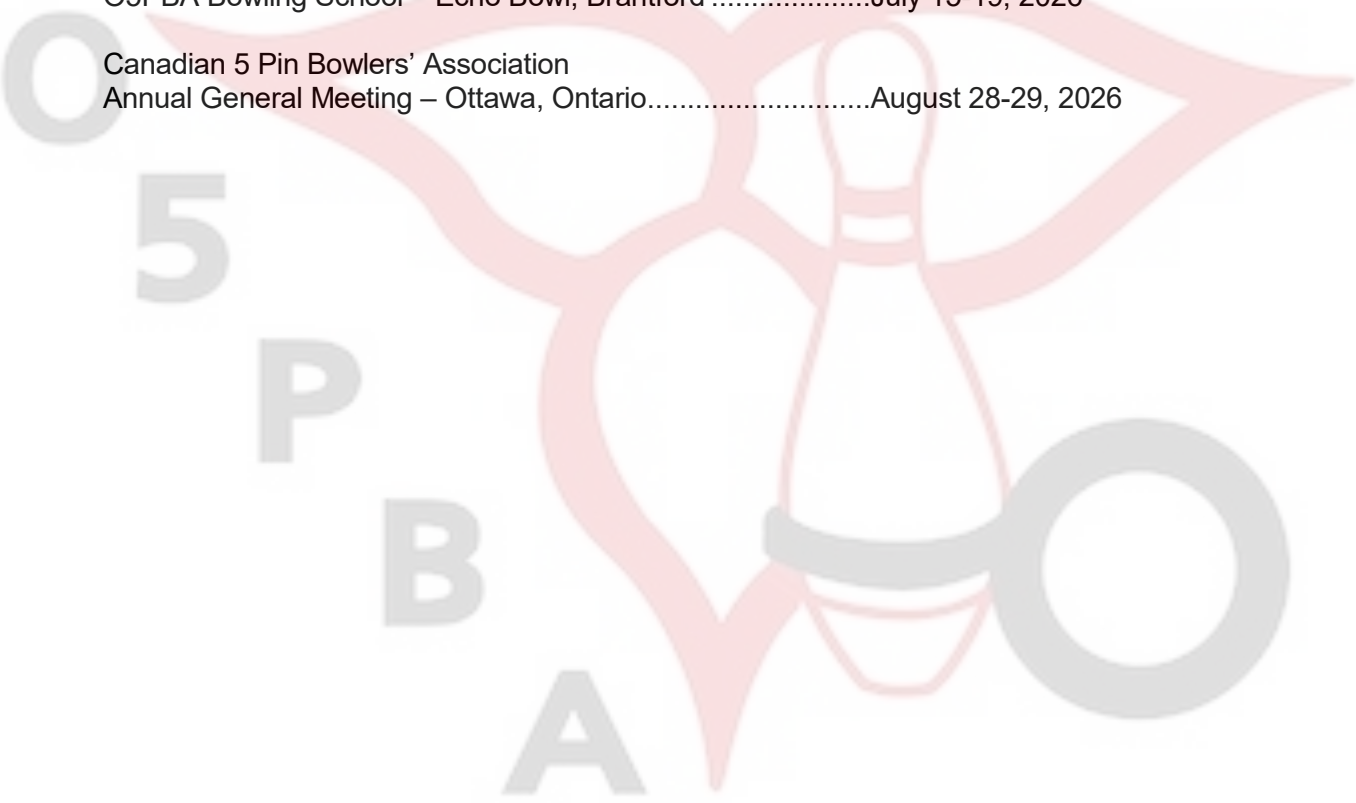

HIGH-LOW DOUBLES 5 PIN CHAMPIONSHIPS/ INTER-PROVINCIAL NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Entry Fee: \$15.00 per bowler
Average Date: October 19, 2025
Entry Deadline: October 19, 2025

Our most popular tournament begins at the local level where high average bowlers and low average bowlers are paired up in their league to compete in a four (4) week pins-over-average tournament.

Following the league round competition, League Champions will be declared and will advance to the Zone/DC finals. Additional teams may advance to the Zone/DC finals based on the number of entries from each league.

The Provincial Championships will consist of four (4) games. The team that finishes in first (1st) place, based on a total team pins-over-average basis, will be declared our Provincial Champions.

In addition four (4) teams will be paired together to form the teams that will represent Ontario at the Inter-Provincial National Championships being held April 22-26, 2026 in Winnipeg, Manitoba.

HIGH-LOW DOUBLES 5 PIN CHAMPIONSHIPS/ INTER-PROVINCIAL NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

FORMAT

The High-Low Doubles 5 Pin Championships consists of four (4) steps:

- LEAGUE ROUND
- ZONE/DC FINALS
- PROVINCIAL CHAMPIONSHIPS
- INTER-PROVINCIAL NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

GENERAL RULES

1. Open to all bowlers **19 YEARS OF AGE AND OVER** as of **DECEMBER 31ST OF THE CURRENT BOWLING SEASON**, and must be a member in good standing of the Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association.
2. Entry fee is \$15.00 per bowler.
3. Entry deadline is **OCTOBER 19, 2025**.
4. Each league, by using bowlers' averages, will select their doubles teams as follows:
 - a) Highest average bowler in the league paired with the lowest average bowler.
 - b) Second highest average bowler in the league paired with the second lowest average bowler, and so on until all of the bowlers have been paired.

EXAMPLE:

37 BOWLERS IN A LEAGUE

Number bowlers from 1st to 37th according to their averages with the highest bowler being 1st.

The 1st bowler (highest average) is paired with the 37th bowler (lowest average).

The 2nd bowler is paired with the 36th bowler, and so on, which will leave the 19th bowler without a partner. This bowler will be paired with the 18th bowler thus giving bowler 18 two (2) partners.

5. **QUALIFYING ROUND POLICY:**
 - a) Bowlers who are members in two (2) or more leagues may enter and compete in each League Round. Bowlers who qualify to advance from more than one (1) league may bowl on more than one (1) doubles team at the Zone/DC finals, only if scheduling permits.

- b) The phrase "if scheduling permits" grants permission for a bowler to compete in more than one Zone/DC final, so long as each of those finals is a separate and distinct competition, occurring on different days, or at substantially different times.
 - c) Bowlers who qualify to bowl on more than one (1) team at the Zone/DC finals, but scheduling does not permit them to bowl on both teams, must bowl on the team from the league that placed higher in the league qualifying round. If a tie exists, the bowler must bowl on the team from the league in which their average is highest as of the specified average date.
 - d) No bowler will be permitted to compete on more than one (1) team at the Provincial Championships. Bowlers qualifying on more than one (1) team for the Provincial Championships must bowl on the team from the league that placed higher in the Zone/DC qualifying round. If a tie exists, the bowler must bowl on the team from the league in which their average is highest as of the specified average date.
6. This event is a doubles pins-over-average (**No Handicap**) tournament.
 7. A league must have a minimum of five (5) paid entries in order to participate. Leagues may submit an extra entry fee to cover additional entries, in order to advance additional teams to the Zone/DC Finals.
 8. Replacements shall be allowed in all rounds except the League Round.
 9. Any bowler who, for any reason, vacates their position on a team for any level of competition forfeits the right to return to competition in this event on that team or any other team. Such withdrawal may result in suspension of tournament/membership privileges of that individual.
 10. A replacement **TEAM** must be the next eligible team in order of finish from the preceding round.
 11.
 - a) A replacement **BOWLER** must be the next eligible bowler in order of finish from the preceding round, provided that the replacement bowler is from the same league and also of equal average rating as the bowler being replaced.
 - b) Equal average rating means the high average bowler on the team may only be replaced by the high average bowler from another team. This rule also applies to the low average bowler.
 - c) If the next eligible bowler from the preceding round is not from the same league as the bowler being replaced, then revert back to each preceding round until the criteria is met.
 12. If a bowler misses a game or games they shall be allowed 95% of their average for any games missed for all rounds except the Provincial Championships.
 13. Scores and averages of winners in all rounds will be authenticated and checked thoroughly. Any falsification or misrepresentation of scores or averages, knowingly or unknowingly, shall result in an automatic disqualification.
 14. Personal bowling balls may be used if facilities permit. House balls must be used if the bowler's personal bowling balls have not been returned (no delay of game).

Two (2) personal bowling balls per competitor will be allowed on the rack at a time.

Personal bowling balls may be randomly inspected at any time during the tournament or on completion of the tournament. The use of personal bowling balls is at the bowler's own risk. The proprietor shall not be liable for any damage to personal bowling balls. Personal bowling balls shall be 4 3/4" to 5" in diameter, and 3 lbs. 4 ozs. to 3 lbs. 12 ozs. in weight, and must be engraved with the bowler's identifying initials or symbols. Should a question arise regarding the legality of a ball, the Tournament Director has the final say. Appeals/ complaints regarding personal bowling balls may be made to the Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association Tournament Committee.

- 15. Canadian 5 Pin Bowlers' Association rules shall apply in all rounds of competition except in the League Round, where league rules shall apply.
- 16. In the case of any dispute, or interpretation of any rule, the decision of the Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association Tournament Committee shall be final. If a Tournament Director encounters a dispute or needs an interpretation of a rule in any event, they can contact the Provincial Office at (416) 426-7167 any time during the event and you will be connected to a Provincial Tournament Committee member. Phones are monitored on Sundays. In the event that a Local Tournament Director is unable to reach the Provincial Office immediately, the benefit of the doubt must be given to the bowler. The bowler must be permitted to compete and the subsequent results are to be held "unofficial" until the problem or question has been referred to the Provincial Office.
- 17. No mechanical noisemakers of any kind will be allowed in any round of the event.
- 18. The following rule will apply to any bowler who is injured during competition:

When a player is unable to complete a game because of injury, the team of which the bowler is a member shall count his/her actual score for the frames completed in the game total, plus one tenth of his/her absentee score (95% of average) for each of the remaining frames.

EXAMPLE:

Bowler CS is a member of a team. He has an average of 169.

Frame 1 – CS rolls a strike

Frame 2 – CS rolls a strike

Frame 3 – CS rolls a strike

Frame 4 – On the first ball, CS slams the ball onto his toe and the ball hits the right corner pin. On the second and third balls, CS misses. CS informs the Tournament Director that he is unable to continue.

For the first four frames, CS has scored 96. The format for missing bowler (absentee score) is 95% of average = 161. Therefore, CS score is:

LEAGUE ROUND

1. Doubles teams shall bowl the number of games normally bowled by that league for four (4) consecutive weeks during regular league play between **OCTOBER 20, 2025** and **NOVEMBER 30, 2025**.
2. Leagues will advance one (1) team of two (2) bowlers each to the Zone/DC finals according to the following formula:

EXAMPLE:

5 to 8 Entries	1 Team Advances
9 to 12 Entries	2 Teams Advance
13 to 16 Entries	3 Teams Advance
17 to 20 Entries	4 Teams Advance
21 to 24 Entries	5 Teams Advance
25 to 28 Entries	6 Teams Advance
29 to 32 Entries	7 Teams Advance
33 to 36 Entries	8 Teams Advance
37 to 40 Entries	9 Teams Advance
41 to 44 Entries	10 Teams Advance and so on

3. All bowlers, who compete in the League Round, must use the following criteria for determining averages:

AVERAGE BOOK: Bowlers must use their rolling average as recorded in the Zone Average Book or on the O5PBA website at www.o5pba.ca.

NON-AVERAGE BOOK: Bowlers with no rolling average recorded in the Zone Average Book or on the O5PBA website, must use their average from the league in which they are competing up to and including **OCTOBER 19, 2025**, with a minimum of twelve (12) games having been bowled.

4. Bowlers qualifying for the Provincial Championships must have bowled a minimum of twenty-one (21) games from the beginning of the 2025-2026 bowling season up to and including **JANUARY 11, 2026** in order to compete in the Provincial Championships.
5. Spare bowlers are ineligible unless they can compete for the four (4) week League Round and are members in good standing of the Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association.
6. The League Round is a four (4) week total pins-over-average event. The doubles team beating their average by the most pins over or the least pins under, if all doubles teams are below their average after four (4) weeks, shall be declared the League Champions. All other qualifying positions will be decided by pins-over-average for the four (4) week period.
7. In the event of a tie (two (2) or more teams are the same number of pins over or under their average) after the final 4th week, the team(s) beating their average by the most pins the final 4th week shall receive the higher placing. If a tie still exists, the team(s) beating their average by the most pins the preceding 3rd week shall receive the higher placing.
8. The team that finishes first (1st) in the league round will receive Champion Lapel Pins.

- 9. If the league rules permit bowl-offs for league play, they are permissible for this round only of the tournament.

- **PROVINCIAL CHAMPIONSHIPS**

GENERAL RULES

1. Open to all bowlers **18 YEARS OF AGE AND OVER** as of **DECEMBER 31ST OF THE CURRENT BOWLING SEASON**, and must be a member in good standing of the Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association.
2. Entrants must be duly elected to a League Executive position to be eligible for this tournament (i.e. **President, Vice-President, Secretary, Statistician, Tournament Director and Treasurer**) **OR** must hold an Executive position on a Zone or Decentralized Association. All Executives must be registered in that position with the Provincial Office to be eligible for this tournament.
3. Both the League Executive Registration Form and the Zone/DC Association Executive listings must be completed and received by the Provincial Office no later than **OCTOBER 19, 2025** in order to be eligible to participate.
4. Each Zone and Decentralized Association will determine the entry fee up to a maximum of \$30.00 per entry.
5. Entry deadline is **OCTOBER 19, 2025**.
6. Format in all rounds will be based on pins-over-average (**No Handicap**).
7. All League and Association Executives shall compete together with the top three (3) bowlers advancing to the Provincial Championships.
8. Entries will only be accepted from Zone and Decentralized Associations that have already submitted their three (3) post-dated cheques, payable to the Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association, to cover the 2025-2026 bowling season membership fees.
9.
 - a) If a copy of the Zone's Average Book (***electronic copy ONLY***) has not been received in the Provincial Office by **JUNE 30, 2025, no bowlers from that Zone or Decentralized Association will be permitted to compete in this event.**
 - b) Any league(s) that have not provided their pinfall/games to the Zone will not be permitted to bowl in the Executives 5 Pin Championships.
10. Bowlers who hold a League Executive position in two (2) or more leagues in the same centre shall only be permitted to bowl once in the Zone/DC Finals.

11. Bowlers who hold a League Executive position in two (2) or more centres may enter in each centre and compete in the Zone/DC Finals in each, provided the scheduling of same permits; but shall only be permitted to bowl once in the Provincial Championships.
12. If a qualifier is unable to compete in the next round, the position shall be filled by the next eligible bowler from the preceding round, provided the substitution is made prior to seven (7) days of the event.
13. Scores and averages of winners in all rounds will be authenticated and checked thoroughly. Any falsification or misrepresentation of scores or averages, knowingly or unknowingly, shall result in an automatic disqualification.
14. Personal bowling balls may be used if facilities permit. House balls must be used if the bowler's personal bowling balls have not been returned (no delay of game). **Two (2) personal bowling balls per competitor will be allowed on the rack at a time.** Personal bowling balls may be randomly inspected at any time during the tournament or on completion of the tournament. The use of personal bowling balls is at the bowler's own risk. The proprietor shall not be liable for any damage to personal bowling balls. Personal bowling balls shall be 4 3/4" to 5" in diameter, and 3 lbs. 4 ozs. to 3 lbs. 12 ozs. in weight, and must be engraved with the bowler's identifying initials or symbols. Should a question arise regarding the legality of a ball, the Tournament Director has the final say. Appeals/complaints regarding personal bowling balls may be made to the Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association Tournament Committee.
15. Canadian 5 Pin Bowlers' Association rules shall apply in all rounds of competition.
16. In the case of any dispute, or interpretation of any rule, the decision of the Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association Tournament Committee shall be final. If a Tournament Director encounters a dispute or needs an interpretation of a rule in any event, they can contact the Provincial Office at (416) 426-7167 any time during the event and you will be connected to a Provincial Tournament Committee member. Phones are monitored on Sundays. In the event that a Local Tournament Director is unable to reach the Provincial Office immediately, the benefit of the doubt must be given to the bowler. The bowler must be permitted to compete and the subsequent results are to be held "unofficial" until the problem or question has been referred to the Provincial Office.
17. The following rule will apply to any bowler who is injured during competition:

When a player is unable to complete a game because of injury, the team of which the bowler is a member shall count his/her actual score for the frames completed in the game total, plus one tenth of his/her absentee score (95% of average) for each of the remaining frames.

EXAMPLE:

Bowler CS is a member of a team. He has an average of 169.

Frame 1 – CS rolls a strike

Frame 2 – CS rolls a strike

Frame 3 – CS rolls a strike

Frame 4 – On the first ball, CS slams the ball onto his toe and the ball hits the right corner pin. On the second and third balls, CS misses. CS informs the Tournament Director that he is unable to continue.

For the first four frames, CS has scored 96. The format for missing bowler (absentee score) is 95% of average = 161. Therefore, CS score is:

ZONE/DC FINALS

1. The Zone/DC Finals shall consist of three (3) games and must be completed on or before **NOVEMBER 16, 2025**. Decentralized Associations have the option of conducting this tournament during regular league play or as a one day roll-off. **Please Note: Zone Associations MUST conduct this tournament as a one day roll-off.**
2. All bowlers who compete in the Zone/DC Finals must use the following criteria for determining averages:

AVERAGE BOOK: Bowlers must use their rolling average as recorded in the Zone Average Book or on the O5PBA website at www.o5pba.ca.

NON-AVERAGE BOOK: Bowlers with no rolling average recorded in the Zone Average Book or on the O5PBA website, must use their highest league average in that Zone or Decentralized Association up to and including **OCTOBER 19, 2025** (highest average if a bowler bowls in two (2) or more leagues) with a minimum of twelve (12) games having been bowled.
3. Substitutions are not allowed in the Zone/DC finals. If an Executive position cannot be filled, then that position is left vacant.
4. In the event of a tie for first (1st) place or the final advancing position, the Zone/DC will decide the tie breaking method from one of the following:
 - a) Individual with the most pins-over-average in the last game

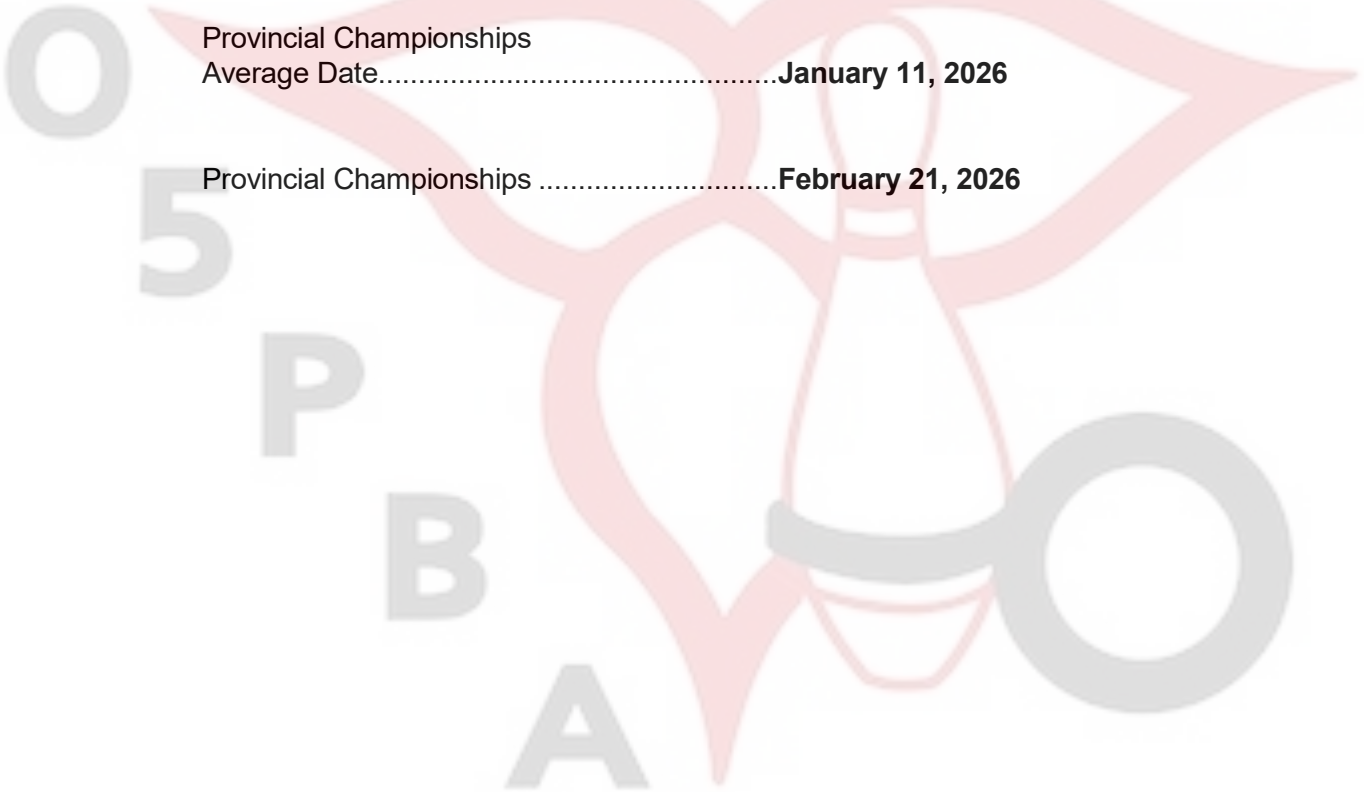

6. A league must have a minimum of ten (10) paid entries in order to participate.
7. Canadian 5 Pin Bowlers' Association rules shall apply in all rounds of competition except in the League Round, where league rules shall apply.
8. **QUALIFYING ROUND POLICY:**
 - a) Bowlers who are members in two (2) or more leagues may enter and compete in each League Round. Bowlers, who qualify to advance from more than one (1) league, may bowl on more than one (1) team at the Zone/DC Finals, only if scheduling permits.
 - b) The phrase if scheduling permits grants permission for a bowler to compete in more than one Zone/DC final so long as each of those rounds is a separate and distinct competition, occurring on different days, or at substantially different times.
 - c) Bowlers who qualify to bowl on more than one (1) team at the Zone/DC Finals, but scheduling does not permit them to bowl on both teams, must bowl on the team from the league that placed higher in the league qualifying round. If a tie exists, the bowler must bowl on the team from the league in which their average is highest as of the specified average date.

10. a) A substitute bowler for the Zone/DC finals must come from the same league as the bowler being replaced and must be the runner-up bowler from the League Round that did not qualify to advance. League Executives shall go down the list of participants in order of finish until a substitute is found.
- b) After the Zone/DC finals, a substitute bowler must come from the same league as the bowler being replaced, and must come from the highest placing team at the Zone/DC finals if two (2) or more teams competed from that league. If only one (1) team competed from that league, the substitute bowler must be the runner-up bowler from the League Round that did not qualify to advance to the Zone/DC finals.
- c) Any bowler who, for any reason, declines to be a substitute in any round is ineligible to be a substitute at any subsequent round.
11. Scores and averages of winners in all rounds will be authenticated and checked thoroughly. Any falsification or misrepresentation of scores or averages, knowingly or unknowingly, shall result in an automatic disqualification.

LEAGUE ROUND

- All entrants shall bowl a one (1) week league round during regular league play, during the weeks of **JANUARY 5-18, 2026**. Bowlers wishing to better their scores from week one will be permitted to re-enter the competition by paying an additional entry fee of \$15.00 and bowl during regular league play during this timeframe.
- The top five (5) qualifiers in the League Round shall form the first team and the next five (5) qualifiers in the League Round shall form the second team, and so on.
- All bowlers who compete in the League Round must use the following criteria for determining averages:

AVERAGE BOOK: Bowlers must use their rolling average as recorded in the Zone Average Book or on the O5PBA website at www.o5pba.ca.

NON-AVERAGE BOOK: Bowlers with no rolling average recorded in the Zone Average Book or on the O5PBA website, must use their average from the league in which they are competing up to and including **JANUARY 4, 2026**, with a minimum of twelve (12) games having been bowled.

4. Bowlers qualifying for the Provincial Championships must have bowled a minimum of twenty-one (21) games from the beginning of the 2025-2026 bowling season up to and including **MARCH 22, 2026**, in order to compete in the Provincial Championships.
5. Leagues will advance one (1) team of five (5) bowlers each to the Zone/DC finals according to the following formula:

Please Note: Leagues with less than the minimum of ten (10) paid entries, but with five (5) or more entries may submit the entry fee covering ten (10) centres (10 x \$15.00) in order to advance a team to the Zone/DC finals. Leagues may also submit the entry fees covering 16, 23, 30, 37, 44 entries and so on in order to advance additional teams to the Zone/DC finals as above.

6. In the event of a tie or ties in total pins over or under their average for purposes of determining qualifiers for the Zone/DC finals, the bowler beating their average by the most pins over, or the least pins under, if all bowlers are below their average in the last game, shall receive the higher placing. If a tie still exists, using the same rule, the scores from the preceding game will be used to break the tie.
7. Teams may select any individual to coach their team at the Zone/DC finals. However, after the Zone/DC finals, all coaches must be **COMMUNITY COACH TRAINED** on or before **DECEMBER 31ST OF THE CURRENT BOWLING SEASON**, and must be a member in good standing of the Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association.
8. If league rules permit bowl-offs for league play, they are permissible for this round only of the tournament.

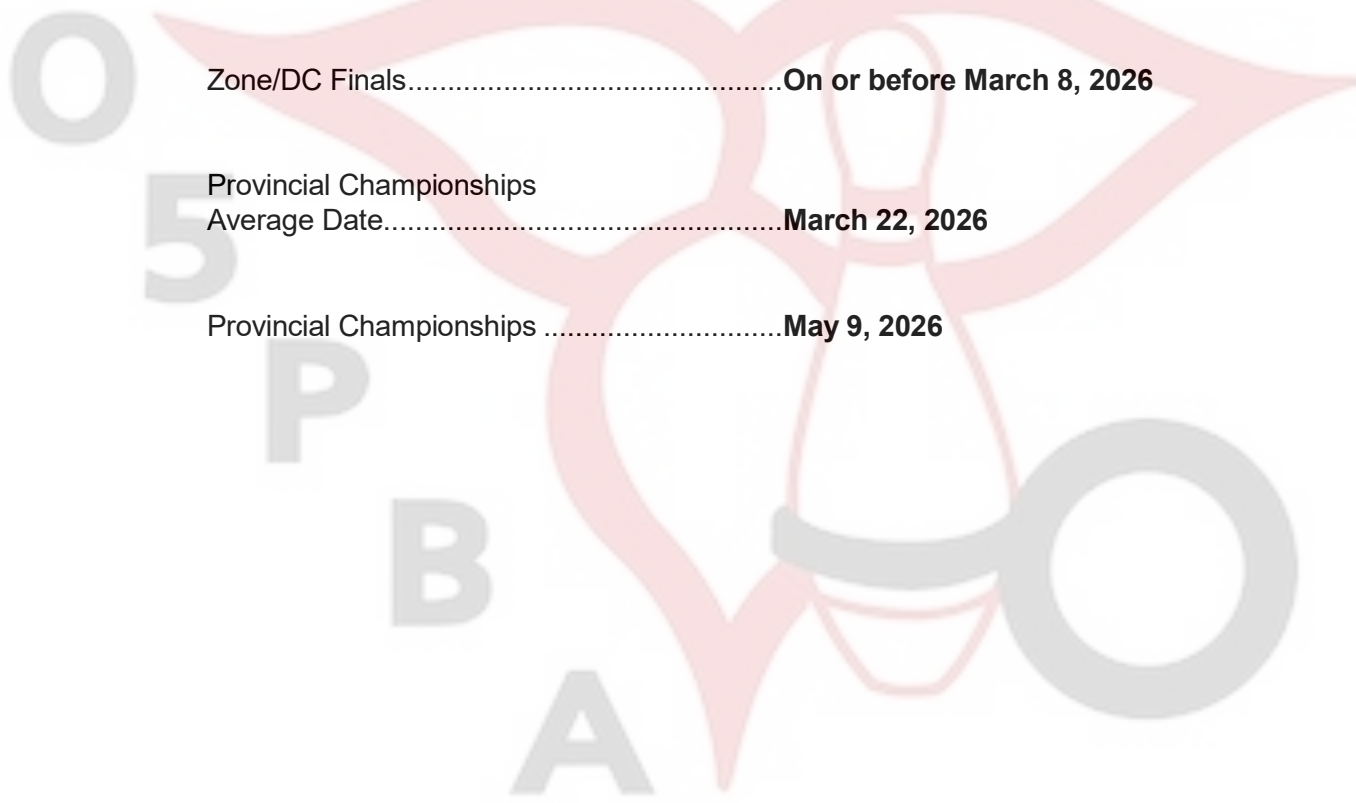

GENERAL RULES

1. Open to all bowlers and coaches **19 YEARS OF AGE AND OVER** as of **DECEMBER 31ST OF THE CURRENT BOWLING SEASON**, and must be a member in good standing of the Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association.
2. Entry deadline to be set by each Zone Association.
3.
 - a) Entry fee to be decided by each Zone Association.
 - b) All Zones must pay the designated assessment for this event.
 - c) **All bowlers and coaches participating in the Provincial Championships must pay an additional assessment fee of \$50.00.**
 - d) **All bowlers and coaches participating in the National Championships must pay a National Open assessment fee of \$200.00.**
4. All bowlers wishing to qualify for both the Regular Open and Senior Open must declare, prior to the start of the tournament, their intent and pay the prevailing entry fee, prior to throwing the first ball.
5. **REPLACEMENT OF A BOWLER POLICY:**
 Replacement of a bowler, once qualified for the Zone Contingent, shall not be permitted unless the reason is submitted **in writing** and signed by said bowler. Under extenuating circumstances, the Provincial Tournament Committee may waive the requirement for a letter from the bowler however; the reason(s) for withdrawal must be verified in writing by the Zone.
6. Any bowler who withdraws, before the next level of competition as in Rule 5 above, is subject to automatic suspension from this event by the Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association and any further participation in the event for the balance of the tournament.
7. Any bowler suspended under the above rule may have the suspension repealed if an acceptable reason for withdrawal is provided in writing. Such a written appeal must be received in the Provincial Office within ninety (90) days of a bowler being advised of their suspension under this rule.
8. Any bowler who withdraws, for any reason at any level of competition forfeits the right to return to competition in this event for the balance of the tournament. **(See General Rules 6 and 7)**

9. Replacement of a bowler on any team may only be made with the approval of the Provincial Tournament Committee. The bowler being replaced shall not be permitted to compete in the Open event for the balance of the tournament.
10. The replacement bowler(s) for each Zone shall be the runner-up (man or lady) from the Zone finals. If a bowler is unable to compete in the Provincial Championships on either the Men's, Ladies' or Mixed team, the replacement bowler will fill the vacant spot. There will be no move-ups from the existing team bowlers. (See Provincial Rule #10)
11. If the replacement bowler takes on a coaching position, they will forfeit the right to be the replacement bowler for their Zone Contingent.
12. If a replacement bowler is unable to compete at the Provincial Championships, a Zone may designate an **EMERGENCY SPARE**. The name of the emergency spare (one man and one lady) must be submitted to the Tournament Committee in writing at a coaches' meeting, or the team goes without for the remainder of the competition. Emergency spares must have entered the Zone finals and must be in a shirt of their Zone colour and identification.
13. A replacement bowler or emergency spare cannot be included in the team's starting line-up for the bowler's **FIRST GAME ONLY**. If the team advances to the National Championships, the replacement bowler or emergency spare shall be deemed to be an original qualifier.
14. When replacement of more than one bowler is approved on any team under General Rules 5 through 11 above, the **FIRST** approved substitute(s) shall be deemed to be an original qualifier.
15. The Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association Tournament Committee reserves the right to complete the field, and all decisions by the Committee shall be final.
16. The Provincial Tournament Committee may, if deemed necessary, run a Wild Card Tournament to eliminate the need for BYES at the Provincial Championships.
17. Personal bowling balls may be used if facilities permit. House balls must be used if the bowler's personal bowling balls have not been returned (no delay of game). **Two (2) personal bowling balls per competitor will be allowed on the rack at a time.** Personal bowling balls may be randomly inspected at any time during the tournament or on completion of the tournament. The use of personal bowling balls is at the bowler's own risk. The proprietor shall not be liable for any damage to personal bowling balls. Personal bowling balls shall be 4 3/4" to 5" in diameter, and 3 lbs. 4 ozs. to 3 lbs. 12 ozs. in weight, and must be engraved with the bowler's identifying initials or symbols. Should a question arise regarding the legality of a ball, the Tournament Director has the final say. Appeals/complaints regarding personal bowling balls may be made to the Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association Tournament Committee.
18. All coaches are required to abide by the rules of the Coaching Policy and Coaches' Instructions.
19. Assistant coaches must be **COMMUNITY COACH TRAINED OR HIGHER** on or before **DECEMBER 31ST OF THE CURRENT BOWLING SEASON**, and must be a member in good standing of the Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association. In the event the coach is unable to participate, the assistant coach will be deemed to be the emergency replacement, providing they are **COMPETITIVE COACH CERTIFIED**.

20. Canadian 5 Pin Bowlers' Association rules shall apply in all rounds.

 - a. Three (3) to four (4) entries will field Singles Competitors only
 - b. Five (5) entries will field a Men's or Ladies' Team (with no spare)
 - c. Six (6) entries will field three (3) Singles Competitors plus a Men's or Ladies' Team
 - d. Seven (7) entries will field three (3) Singles Competitors, plus a Men's, Ladies' and Mixed Team, with no spares on all teams

10. In the event of a tie for any qualifying position, a one (1) game roll-off shall be held to determine the final placing.
11. Coaches shall be selected by each team (**Men's, Ladies' and Mixed**) at the completion of the Zone finals. All coaches must be **COMPETITIVE COACH CERTIFIED** on or before **DECEMBER 31ST OF THE CURRENT BOWLING**, and must be a member in good standing of the Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association. Rule 2 b) above may also be applied to choice of coaches. - 6. In the event of a tie for the last qualifying position, a one (1) game roll-off shall be held to determine the final placing.
- 7. A coach shall be selected by the team at the completion of the Zone finals. All coaches and assistant coaches must be a minimum **COMMUNITY COACH TRAINED** on or before **DECEMBER 31ST OF THE CURRENT BOWLING SEASON**, and must be a member in good standing of the Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association.

Rule 2 b) above may also be applied to choice of coaches. If a team cannot decide on a coach from within their Zone, the selection will be done based on the new guidelines in the Coaching Selection under Open Championships.

- 8. For the Open and the Senior Open, if scheduling permits, bowlers can coach another division at Provincials.

GENERAL RULES

1. Open to all bowlers **50 YEARS OF AGE AND OVER** as of **DECEMBER 31ST OF THE CURRENT BOWLING SEASON**, and must be a member in good standing of the Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association. Bowlers 50 to 64 years of age will bowl in the Junior-Senior Division. Bowlers 65 years of age and over will bowl in the Senior Division.
2. Entry fee is \$125.00 per Zone/DC Association, League or Bowling Centre and per Division (**Junior-Senior and/or Senior**).
3. Entry deadline is **FEBRUARY 15, 2026**.
4. Format in all rounds to be based on pins-over-average (**No Handicap**).
5. Canadian 5 Pin Bowlers' Association rules shall apply in all rounds of competition except in the House Round, where house rules shall apply.
6. If a qualifier is unable to compete in the next round, the position shall be filled by the next eligible bowler from the previous round, provided the substitution is made prior to seven (7) days of the event.
7. In the event of a tie or ties in total pins over or under their average, the bowler beating their average by the most pins over or the least pins under, if all bowlers are below their average, in the last game, shall receive the higher placing. If a tie still exists, using the same rule, the scores from the preceding game will be used to break the tie.
8. Personal bowling balls may be used if facilities permit. House balls must be used if the bowler's personal bowling balls have not returned (no delay of game). **Two (2) personal bowling balls per competitor will be allowed on the rack at a time**. Personal bowling balls may be randomly inspected at any time during the tournament or on completion of the tournament. The use of personal bowling balls is at the bowler's own risk. The proprietor shall not be liable for any damage to personal bowling balls. Personal bowling balls shall be 4 3/4" to 5" in diameter, 3 lbs. 4 ozs. to 3 lbs. 12 ozs. in weight, and must be engraved with the bowler's identifying initials or symbols. Should a question arise regarding the legality of a ball, the Tournament Director has the final say.

Appeals/complaints regarding personal bowling balls may be made to the Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association Tournament Committee.

9. In the case of any dispute, or interpretation of any rule, the decision of the Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association Tournament Committee shall be final. If a Tournament Director encounters a dispute or needs an interpretation of a rule in any event, they can contact the Provincial Office at (416) 426-7167 any time during the event and you will be connected to a Provincial Tournament Committee member. Phones are monitored on Sundays. In the event that a Local Tournament Director is unable to reach the Provincial Office immediately, the benefit of the doubt must be given to the bowler. The bowler must be permitted to compete and the subsequent results are to be held "unofficial" until the problem or question has been referred to the Provincial Office.

10. The following rule will apply to any bowler who is injured during competition:

When a player is unable to complete a game because of injury, the team of which the bowler is a member shall count his/her actual score for the frames completed in the game total, plus one tenth of his/her absentee score (95% of average) for each of the remaining frames.

EXAMPLE:

Bowler CS is a member of a team. He has an average of 169.

Frame 1 – CS rolls a strike

Frame 2 – CS rolls a strike

Frame 3 – CS rolls a strike

ZONE/DC FINALS

1. The Zone/DC finals shall consist of three (3) games.

2. Each league may enter as many three (3) player teams as they wish (**minimum of three (3) teams**). **Any bowler wishing to bowl on more than one team in the League Round will be permitted to do so, provided they pay an additional entry fee of \$15.00 per bowler per entry.**
3. Entry deadline is **FEBRUARY 1, 2026**.
4. Entry fee is \$15.00 per bowler.
5. Format in all rounds will be based on total pins-over-average (**No Handicap**).
6. A league must have a minimum of nine (9) paid entries in order to participate.
7. Canadian 5 Pin Bowlers' Association rules shall apply in all rounds of competition, except in the League Round, where league rules shall apply.
8. **QUALIFYING ROUND POLICY:**
 - a) Bowlers who are members in two (2) or more leagues may enter and compete in each League Round. Bowlers, who qualify to advance from more than one (1) league, may bowl on more than one (1) team at the Zone/DC finals, only if scheduling permits. Likewise, bowlers who qualify to advance from more than one (1) team from the same league, may bowl on more than one (1) team at the Zone/DC finals, only if scheduling permits.
 - b) The phrase "if scheduling permits" grants permission for a bowler to compete in more than one Zone/DC final, so long as each of those finals is a separate and distinct competition, occurring on different days, or at substantially different times.

- d) No bowler will be permitted to compete on more than one (1) team at the Provincial Championships. Bowlers qualifying on more than one (1) team for the Provincial Championships must bowl on the team from the league that placed higher in the Zone/DC qualifying round. If a tie exists, the bowler must bowl on the team from the league in which their average is highest as of the specified average date.
9. At the Zone/DC finals, and each subsequent round, each team will consist of three (3) bowlers. All three (3) bowlers shall bowl, and all three (3) bowlers shall count.

1. Teams shall bowl the number of games normally bowled by that league for three (3) consecutive weeks during regular league play between **FEBRUARY 2, 2026** and **MARCH 8, 2026**.
2. All bowlers, who compete in the League Round, must use the following criteria for determining averages:

AVERAGE BOOK: Bowlers must use their rolling average as recorded in the Zone Average Book or on the O5PBA website at www.o5pba.ca.

NON-AVERAGE BOOK: Bowlers with no rolling average recorded in the Zone Average Book or on the O5PBA website, must use their average from the league in which they are competing up to and including **FEBRUARY 1, 2026**, with a minimum of twelve (12) games having been bowled.

3. Bowlers qualifying for the Provincial Championships must have bowled a minimum of twenty-one (21) games from the beginning of the 2025-2026 bowling season up to and including **APRIL 12, 2026** in order to compete in the Provincial Championships.
4. Spare bowlers are ineligible unless they can compete for the three (3) week League Round and are members in good standing of the Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association.
5. The League Round is a three (3) week total pins-over-average event. The triples team beating their average by the most pins over or the least pins under, if all triples teams are below their average after three (3) weeks, shall be declared the League Champions. All other qualifying positions will be decided by pins-over-average for the three (3) week period.
6. Missing bowlers shall be allowed 95% of their average for any games missed during this round.
7. Leagues will advance one (1) team of three (3) bowlers each to the Zone/DC finals according to the following formula:

8. In the event of a tie (two (2) or more teams are the same number of pins over or under their average) after the final 3rd week, the team(s) beating their average by the most pins the final 3rd week shall receive the higher placing. If a tie still exists, the team(s) beating their average by the most pins the preceding 2nd week shall receive the higher placing.
9. The team that finishes first (1st) in the league round will receive Champion Lapel Pins.
10. If the league rules permit bowl-offs for league play, they are permissible for this round only of the tournament.
11. Teams may select any individual to coach their team at the Zone/DC finals. 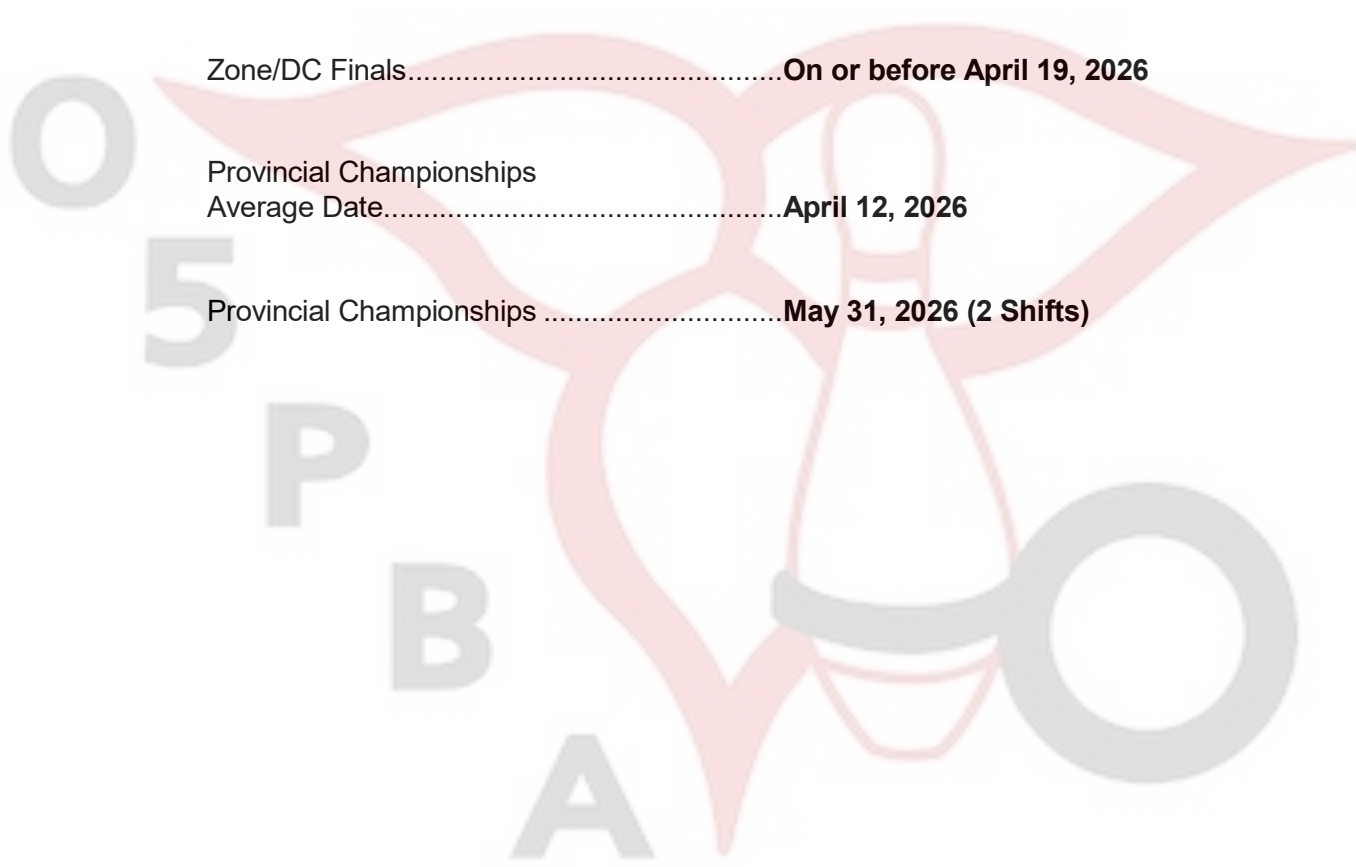

AVERAGE RULE/AVERAGE BOOK CLARIFICATION

For the 2025-26 season, we will be returning to a three-year rolling average. Data from the 2022-23, 2023-24 and 2024-25 seasons will be used to calculate the 2025-26 rolling averages. This includes all games from all O5 Provincial Tournaments or any other O5 sanctioned event. Bowlers who have less than three years bowled, will be calculated on the years bowled in this timeframe.

PLEASE NOTE: ALL GAMES BOWLED DURING LEAGUE PLAY INCLUDING PLAY-OFFS MUST BE INCLUDED FOR THE ROLLING AVERAGE TO BE CALCULATED. BANKED SCORES SHOULD NOT BE USED TO CALCULATE A BOWLER'S AVERAGE AS NO GAMES SHOULD BE COUNTED MORE THAN ONCE.

Following are specific guidelines for proper averages at each round of our events:

LEAGUE ROUNDS

All bowlers who compete in the League Round must use the following criteria for determining averages:

AVERAGE BOOK: Bowlers must use their rolling average as recorded in the Zone Average Book or on the O5PBA website at www.o5pba.ca.

NON-AVERAGE BOOK: Bowlers with no rolling average recorded in the Zone Average Book or on the O5PBA website, must use their average from the league in which they are competing up to and including the specified average date with a minimum of twelve (12) games having been bowled.

ZONE/DC FINALS

All bowlers who compete in the Zone/DC finals must use the following criteria for determining averages:

AVERAGE BOOK: Bowlers must use their rolling average as recorded in the Zone Average Book or on the O5PBA website at www.o5pba.ca.

NON-AVERAGE BOOK: Bowlers with no rolling average recorded in the Zone Average Book or on the O5PBA website, must use their highest league average in that Zone or Decentralized Association up to and including the specified average date (highest average if a bowler bowls in two (2) or more leagues), with a minimum of twelve (12) games having been bowled.

PROVINCIAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

All bowlers competing in the Provincial Championships must have bowled a minimum of twenty-one (21) games during the current bowling season up to and including the specified average date and must use the following criteria for determining averages:

AVERAGE BOOK: New for the 2025-26 season is a Provincial Tournament Average. The Provincial tournament average will be calculated as each tournament's pinfall (Zone/DC and Provincials) is submitted for the current season, before the start of the Provincial tournament. The Tournament Committee reserves the right to adjust a bowler's average at a Provincial Championship, based on all leagues and sanctioned tournaments that they bowled in during the past three (3) seasons, plus the current season, to ensure that their average reflects the bowler's true ability.

NON-AVERAGE BOOK: Bowlers with no rolling average recorded in the Zone Average Book or on the O5PBA website, must use the highest of the following, as determined by the Provincial Office: Use their highest league average up to and including the specified average date (highest average if a bowler bowls in two (2) or more leagues), and as established in any league in Ontario.

- OR -

Use their average based on the median between their highest league average up to and including the specified average date, and the average based on the twenty-one (21) games (seven weeks) leading up to the specified average date.

PLEASE NOTE: WHEN ESTABLISHING A LEAGUE OR TOURNAMENT AVERAGE, A RIGHT-HANDED BOWLER MUST BOWL RIGHT-HANDED AT ALL TIMES. SIMILARLY, A LEFT-HANDED BOWLER MUST BOWL LEFT-HANDED AT ALL TIMES. SIMILARLY, A BOWLER USING A MECHANICAL AID MUST BOWL WITH THE MECHANICAL AID AT ALL TIMES. EVEN WITH A MECHANICAL AID, CHANGING HANDS WILL ESTABLISH A NEW AVERAGE. NO COMBINATION OF SCORES BOWLED USING THE LEFT AND RIGHT HAND CAN BE USED IN COMPUTING AN AVERAGE.

ONCE A BOWLER HAS ESTABLISHED AN AVERAGE USING EITHER THE LEFT HAND OR RIGHT HAND, THEY MAY NOT SWITCH AND USE THE OPPOSITE HAND.

PLEASE NOTE: BANKED SCORES SHOULD NOT BE USED TO CALCULATE A BOWLER'S AVERAGE AS NO GAMES SHOULD BE COUNTED MORE THAN ONCE. (SEE SCORES OF SEPT. 24-25 IN EXAMPLE SHOWN ABOVE)

ONTARIO 5 PIN BOWLERS' ASSOCIATION AWARDS PROGRAM

Many Zone and Decentralized Associations are participants in the Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association's Awards Program. However, not all Zones and Decentralized Associations offer this program. Contact your Local Zone or Decentralized Association representative to see if you are eligible.

QUALIFICATIONS:

SINGLE GAME – To qualify the score bowled must be a minimum of 100 pins over the bowler's current league average.

TRIPLE GAME ** - To qualify the score bowled must be a minimum of 150 pins over the bowler's current league average over three (3) consecutive games.

** If a league bowls more than three (3) games, the qualifying score must be accumulated in the **FIRST THREE GAMES BOWLED**.

Example:

A bowler with a current league average of 125 who bowls a 225 **SINGLE GAME** will receive a 225 pin. He/she can earn the 250 pin by bowling between 250 up to 274.

A bowler with a current league average of 190 (x 3 = 570) who bowls a 720 **TRIPLE GAME** will receive a 700 pin. He/she can earn the 750 pin by bowling between 750 up to 799.

THE AWARDS PROGRAM IS BASED ON A PINS-OVER-AVERAGE FORMAT FOR BOTH A SINGLE GAME AND TRIPLE GAMES.

The Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association Awards Program will consist of the following award categories for the 2025-26 bowling season:

Single Pins: Beginning at 200 and increasing in denominations of 25 up to 425 (i.e. 250, 275, 300, 325).

Triple Pins: Beginning at 500 and increasing in denominations of 50 up to 950 maximum (i.e. 600, 650, 700, 750).

Miscellaneous: Aces Spared, Head Pin Spared, Split Spared
(The above pins require the C5PBA Collection Pin - 5 awards can be attached to each Collection Pin).

League Champion Pin, O5PBA Pin, C5PBA Membership Pin.

Bars: 900, 1000, President, Past-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Merit (These bars require the Executive Pin).

THERE IS A "450" SINGLE BAR, WHICH CANNOT BE PURCHASED. THE O5PBA PRESENTS THIS AWARD FOR SANCTIONED PERFECT GAMES ONLY.

METHOD FOR COLLECTING AWARDS

1. The League Secretary is to submit (in writing) their request for awards for all their league bowlers to the Local Zone or Decentralized Association Awards Chair. The Zone or Decentralized Association will determine the method of ordering the awards and how often. This should be verified by the League Secretary at the start of the bowling season.
2. Once the request for awards is received, the Local Zone or Decentralized Association Awards Chair will ensure that the awards are delivered to the League Secretary at the bowling centre for distribution.
3. The distribution of the awards to the individual bowlers will be dependent on the league preference. For example, the award pins, can be distributed to the individual bowler during regular league play, or retained for presentation at the year-end banquet.

In addition to the above, individual awards for leagues that have 100% membership in the Association, may provide **LEAGUE CHAMPION PINS** for their winners.

Note: Please check with your Local Zone or Decentralized Association as some organizations do not offer this program.

2025–2026 PERFECT GAME POLICY

Each year the O5PBA fields a number of questions regarding recognition of perfect “450” games. In order to qualify for the Perfect Game Awards, a bowler must meet the following requirements:

1. He/she must be a member in good standing of the C5PBA for the current bowling season. *
2. He/she must have bowled the Perfect 450 Single Game in either a **SANCTIONED** tournament or during regular league play (**no pre-bowling**). **
3. His/her score must be a **SCRATCH** (without handicap) score.
4. For a Perfect Game to be recognized, all C5PBA rules must be in effect.
5. The lanes must be certified in accordance with O5PBA certification policy. ***
6. The game must be reported to the Local Association within 48 hours by a league or tournament official.
7. The current reporting form must be completed and forwarded to the Provincial Association.

- For the purpose of clarification:

- * 1 Bowler must have purchased a membership card prior to bowling the perfect game.
- ** 2A In the 2025/2026 bowling season, **ALL O5PBA** (C5PBA), and **MBAO PROVINCIAL TOURNAMENTS** are sanctioned by O5PBA.
- 2B YBO leagues and tournaments are not sanctioned by the O5PBA. This in no way questions the legitimacy of any game(s) rolled, but simply notes that such game(s) are outside of our mandate for recognition. YBO operates under the direction of Bowl Canada 5 Pin. Their league and tournament play, as well as awards and recognition, are age specific and available to all YBO members. Although we cannot recognize such game(s) provincially, local Zones or Decentralized Associations may choose to reward individual YBO achievements within their jurisdiction.
- *** 3 Exceptions see **C5PBA Rules and Regulations, Section B, Rule 14 (c)**

All of the above are automatically suspended under the rules and regulations specific to the Open. This rule applies to bowlers and coaches who, after becoming a member of a team, withdrew before the next level of competition.

Their letters of appeal should do three things:

- a) Request the suspension be lifted;
- b) Provide good and sufficient reason for their withdrawal;
- c) Provide some assurance that the same reason will not likely lead to their withdrawal in the future.

Once such a letter has been received, the Board of Directors may ask the bowlers to personally attend a meeting to present their case.

Any of these bowlers who want to participate in the 2025-2026 Open should ensure their letter of appeal reaches the Provincial Office on or before **SEPTEMBER 1, 2025**.

COACHING SUSPENSIONS

At the present time there are no suspensions from our Coaching Program, except that as noted above. Anyone under suspension from the annual Ontario Open Championships is ineligible not only to bowl, but also to participate as a coach in that event unless and until the suspension is lifted.

ONTARIO 5 PIN BOWLERS' ASSOCIATION PROGRAM BENEFITS

When your league joins the O5PBA you will receive the following:

- Each member of your league will be eligible to enter any or all tournaments sanctioned by the O5PBA.
- Each member of your league will be eligible for all awards administered by the O5PBA, as well as any awards administered by your Local Association.
- Each member of your league will be eligible for the Perfect Game Award.
- Each league will receive a League Sanction Certificate and Decal.
- Each league will receive a Secretary's Handbook containing a handicap chart, league and individual standing sheets, program formats and a complete agenda of the year's activity.
- Each league will receive, upon request:
 - A copy of the C5PBA Rule Book
 - A Secretary Helper, which contains an average calculator and league scheduling chart.
 - Suggested Rules for Better League Operation.
- Each league will be eligible for League Bonding Protection.
- The Seniors/Special Olympics/Blind Bowlers/YBO Under 18 membership, exclusive to those leagues only, is \$7.00 and includes all services and benefits now offered. However tournament entry fees for the High-Low Doubles, Holiday Classic and Triples tournaments are extra.
- **YBO GRADUATES** that join your league, in their first year of eligibility, **will receive a FREE Tournament Membership**. The tournament membership includes all services and benefits now offered, and will also include one (1) tournament entry fee for the **High-Low Doubles, Holiday Classic and Triples Tournaments**.

Other functions of the O5PBA include:

- Develop and monitor uniform rules and regulations of the sport of 5 pin bowling.
- Aid and assist senior citizens, blind and disabled bowlers.
- Work in harmony with all 5 pin bowling organizations.
- Responsible for the setting and monitoring of the standards and specifications for the sport, which includes certifying all bowling lanes and equipment.
- Provide leagues with information on conducting a successful league.

- Govern the conduct of all affiliated members.
- Recognize and keep accurate records of special achievements (*i.e. perfect game awards and record scores program*).
- Conduct an annual youth bowling school where we develop the skills of youth bowlers using LTAD (held in July).
- Conduct courses for adults upon demand (*i.e. Community Coach, Lane Certification, Tournament Director, Introduction to Competition*).
- Organize Provincial, Zone and Decentralized Associations and provide an interesting program for its members.
- Sanction all tournaments.
- Encourage sponsors to contribute to the promotion of 5 pin bowling in Ontario.
- Honour founders, proprietors, technicians, suppliers, bowlers and other worthy groups or individuals in the Bowlers' Hall of Fame.
- Organize an Annual General Meeting to coordinate and discuss all phases of the sport of 5 pin bowling.
- Represent all 5 pin bowlers in Ontario for the purpose of obtaining government grants to further the sport of 5 pin bowling in Ontario.

ONTARIO 5 PIN BOWLERS' ASSOCIATION RECORD SCORES FORMAT

The C5PBA Record Scores Program is designed to recognize individuals and teams for their outstanding achievements in 5 pin bowling. The program is conducted on an annual basis and scores that beat existing records are inserted in the All Time Record Scores. The Record Scores Program shall observe the following general rules:

1. Records to be maintained at the House, Zone, Provincial and National levels.
2. Records to be maintained in two (2) basic divisions:
 - ◆ **INDIVIDUAL RECORDS**
 - ◆ **TEAM RECORDS**
3. League and tournament records are to be maintained separately.
4. Individual records to be maintained in conjunction with the five average classifications.
5. Averages to be used for individual records shall be the league average of the previous year or after twenty-one (21) games for new bowlers. Bowler remains in the same average class for the full bowling season.
6. Team records shall comply to the following:
 - a) Separate records kept for Ladies', Men's and Mixed Teams.
 - b) A team consists of a minimum of two players.
 - c) Same bowlers need not count each game.
 - d) A Mixed Team score must include a minimum of one person of each gender.
 - e) Average classifications do not apply.
7. Scores to be recognized as records only at the end of each season.
8. Tournament records to be compiled according to individual tournament formats.
9. Single, triple, four and five game scores to be maintained in league records.
10. Triple, four and five game records must be bowled consecutively on the same day and include the first game bowled.
11. Master Bowlers' Association scores to be compared to Provincial and Canadian Open Records.
12. End of Year Awards will be presented by the Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association at the end of the season for the highest single and triple in each class for that season.
13. All Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association or Zone and Decentralized Association tournaments are eligible for the Record Scores Program at all rounds.
14. Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association rules and regulations must be observed, e.g. certified lanes, foul lines.

15. **AVERAGE RULE**

- a) Bowler in two or more leagues in a house must use highest average for house record scores.
- b) Bowler in two or more leagues in different Houses in a Zone must use highest average for Zone record.
- c) Bowler in two or more leagues in different Zones must use highest average for Provincial record scores.

LEAGUE DIVISION RULES

1. All scores must be bowled in league play only, without handicap. No bowl-off scores are allowed.
2. Record scores will be recognized for one or two frames bowled at a time, alternating lanes.
3. Individual records maintained in conjunction with the five average classifications as shown below:

AVERAGE CLASS	MEN	LADIES
Class I	0 – 165	0 – 155
Class II	166 – 185	156 – 175
Class III	186 – 205	176 – 195
Class IV	206 – 225	196 – 215
Class V	226 & Up	216 & Up

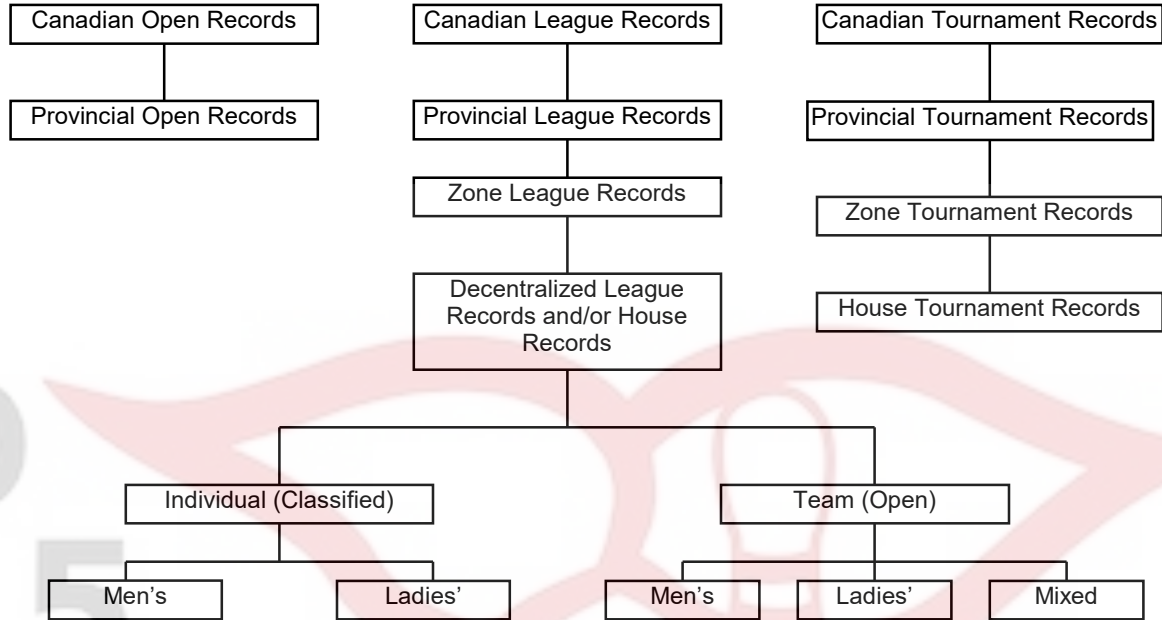
4. The following average classifications have been adopted for all registered bowlers who are members of a **Sanctioned Blind Bowlers or Special Olympics Ontario league**:

AVERAGE CLASS	MEN	LADIES
Class I	0 – 95	0 – 85
Class II	96 – 115	86 – 105
Class III	116 – 135	106 – 125
Class IV	136 – 155	126 – 145
Class V	156 & Up	146 & Up

5. Where league format dictates that one individual score from a team is dropped each game, that team will only be eligible for consideration in the category which includes all team member scores. E.G., if a six player team scratches one score in league format and counts five scores, the team should be entered as a six player team with all scores included.
6. Should a player for a team not be in attendance during league play, the team should be considered a full team. E.G., If a six player team has one or more members not in attendance, that team is still considered a six player team and not a lesser amount due to attendance.
7. In cases where teams are short of players and vacancy or absentee scores are used, record scores will not be recognized, but any individual member of the team rolling high or record scores shall be recognized providing the match has been bowled according to the rules.

- The reporting forms are to be completed and forwarded in a timely manner to the Local Association according to the established reporting schedule.

RECORD SCORES PROCEDURE

The following instructions are to be observed by the League Secretary in order to properly initiate the Record Scores Program in their respective leagues.

- At the conclusion of the bowling season, each League Secretary should complete an Individual and Team Report Form filling in the highest scores **(without handicap)** for all categories that apply. **(See Individual Record Score Report Form and Team Record Score Report Form)**
- League Secretaries should make sure that the bowlers' membership numbers are listed on the Individual and Team Report Forms.
- When submitting individual record scores for **NEW BOWLERS**, the League Secretary should provide their twenty-one (21) game average. This will eliminate the possibility of a bowler being put in the wrong average classification.
- The reporting forms are to be completed and forwarded to the Record Scores Chair in your Local Zone or Decentralized Association no later than **JUNE 1, 2026**.
- From these scores the Record Scores Chair shall select the highest scores for all categories. These scores shall then be entered and posted on their respective score boards.
