**The Ontario Open 5 Pin Championships shall be bowled
at Echo Bowl in Brantford, Ontario and C & D Lanes in
Woodstock, Ontario during the period April 1-4, 2026.**

**Zone Champions competing in the 2026 Ontario Open 5
Pin Championships will receive:**

- 1. Awards**
- 2. Free Bowling at Provincials**
- 3. Victory Banquet**

**All Ontario Champions will receive a trip to St. John's,
Newfoundland to compete in the National Championships
conducted by the Canadian 5 Pin Bowlers' Association.**

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- O5PBA Green Book rules will govern this tournament.
- This Championship is open to all members of the Ontario 5 Pin Bowlers' Association, **19 years of age and over as of December 31 of the current bowling season**, residing in Ontario.
- Entry Fee is to be decided by each Zone Association.
- All Zones must pay the designated assessment for this event.
- All bowlers, coaches and assistant coaches participating in the Provincial Championships must pay an additional assessment fee of \$50.00.**
- All bowlers and coaches participating in the National Championships must pay a National Open assessment fee of \$200.00.**
- All bowlers wishing to qualify for both the Regular Open and Senior Open must declare, prior to the start of the tournament, their intent and pay the prevailing entry fee, prior to throwing the first ball.
- Entry Deadline and Qualifying dates - See entry panel. Acceptance of late entries are subject to availability of lanes.
- Entry form, along with a cheque or money order must be sent and made payable to the organization listed in the entry panel.
- Zone Associations will conduct their own roll-offs. Twenty (20) games will be bowled. **To qualify for the Open, a bowler must bowl one (1) game to be eligible.**
- The top nine (9) men and the top nine (9) ladies, based on total pinfall, at the completion of the Zone finals, shall qualify for the Provincial Championships from **April 1-4, 2026**.
- The top three (3) men and the top three (3) ladies from each Zone, qualify to bowl in the singles competition at the Provincial Championships. Singles bowlers will also bowl in the team events.
- In the event of a tie for any qualifying position, a one (1) game roll-off shall be held to determine the final placing.
- The winner of the men's, ladies' and mixed teams, along with the men's and ladies' singles winners, will receive a trip to compete in the 2026 National Championships in St. John's, Newfoundland.
- All qualifiers who withdraw after having qualified to advance to the next level of competition are subject to automatic suspension from future participation in the Ontario Open Championships until that suspension is successfully appealed.
- The O5PBA Tournament Committee reserves the right to complete the field, and all decisions by the Committee shall be final.
- All bowlers must hold a membership card in the Zone in which they participate. All entries are subject to membership verification.**
- a) All bowlers may bowl in the Zone of their "Principal Residence".
Definition of Principal Residence: As a guide, Principal Residence shall be the residence individuals use for taxation purposes, driver's licence, etc. Bowlers with more than one residence, such as commuters or individuals living away from home for employment reasons, must contact the Provincial Office for a ruling.
b) Bowlers/coaches who only compete in regular league play as registered members of an O5PBA sanctioned or affiliated league, in the Zone of their principal residence, and individuals who do not compete in an O5PBA sanctioned or affiliated league, must enter the Open in the Zone of their principal residence.
c) **Bowlers/coaches will be eligible to compete in the Open in the Zone of their choice, if they have a rolling average in that Zone, with a minimum of fifty (50) games over three (3) years, as published in the Zone Average Book and on the O5PBA website every year. That average will be based on fifty (50) games over regular league play and/or O5 tournament play with that zone.**
Note: A coach who is not actively bowling at all (not an O5 member from any league) will be exempt from the 50-game rolling average criteria, so they can coach in a non-resident Zone.
d) All qualifiers to the Zone Contingent shall have their residence verified by the Zone Association Tournament Director.
e) The penalty for bowling in the wrong Zone is an automatic suspension from the event.
f) All decisions may be appealed. Requests to have suspensions lifted must be made in writing to the Provincial Board of Directors. (For exceptions to this rule, see Green Book, Zone Finals, or contact your Zone Tournament Director).

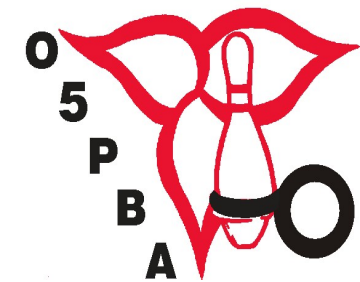
